Debut picture book drawing on lived experience with family suicide

10 September 2023: Ryan Abramowitz, debut author and illustrator has self-published a picture book titled Elegy for an Elephant (EFAE), inspired by the passing of his father to suicide to time with World Suicide Awareness Day (10 September). The book chronicles his family's experience in processing the complexity of post-suicide grief and was designed as a support resource for kids aged 7+ similarly navigating these life events. The book will also be made available as a tool for clinicians, parents, and schools to aid in addressing this challenging subject matter.



"I struggled to come to terms with my father's decision to end his life and felt that a picture book could help other grieving families in a similar position," Abramowitz said. "There is a clear shortage of suicide related literature and I was determined to create a book that is both a warm embrace during a tender time, and an outlet for honouring human connection."





According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics 3144 deaths by suicide occurred in Australia in 2021, around 8-9 lives per day, with many more attempts yearly. At present, suicide is the leading cause of death for Australians aged 15-44 (Australian Institute of Health and Welfare) with the median age of death by suicide being 44.8 years, compared to 82.0 years for all causes of death (ABS).

"By donating 18% of profits to mental health services including Lifeline, Movember and Support After Suicide Services, I hope to help those mourning to feel seen and supported in their darkest hour." Ryan said.
